Evaluation of the 'Aam Aadmi Bima Yojana (AABY)', a welfare scheme of Ministry of Labour & Employment.

Government of India was implementing Aam Aadmi Bima Yojana (AABY), a social sector insurance scheme which provided life insurance cover to the economically backward sections of the society. 'Aam Aadmi Bima Yojana (AABY)' extended life and disability cover to persons between the ages of 18 years to 59 years, living below and marginally above the poverty line under 48 identified vocational / occupational groups. AABY provided insurance cover for a sum of ₹30,000/- on natural death, and ₹75,000/- on death due to accident. The Scheme also provided an add-on-benefit, wherein Scholarship of ₹100 per month per child was paid on half

yearly basis to a maximum of two children per member, studying in 9th to 12th Standard. The total annual premium under the Scheme was ₹200/- per beneficiary of which, 50 per cent was contributed from the Social Security Fund created by the Central Government and maintained by LIC. The balance 50 per cent of the premium was contributed by the State Government / Nodal Agency / Individual as the case may be. The scheme was being implemented through Life Insurance Corporation of India (LIC).

2. The scheme has since been converged to Pradhan Mantri Jeevan Jyoti Bima Yojana (PMJJBY)/Pradhan Mantri Suraksha Bima Yojana (PMSBY) for those between 18 years and 50 years but continues for those between 51-59 years. As per the Government stipulation, continuation of the said scheme will be based on a third party evaluation of the benefits delivered to workers in the past.

3. It is hereby requested that you may kindly Submit Expression of Interest for undertaking the Evaluation of the 'Aam Aadmi Bima Yojana'.

4. The terms of reference for the Evaluation will be to undertake a detailed review of the Aam Admi Bima Yojana to determine the efficacy and suggest any remedial measures, if any. The final output to be submitted by the Evaluating Institute to the O/o DGLW will be a comprehensive evaluation report.

5. The Expression of Interest to be submitted should include the following:

- a) Detailed professional profile of the Organisation,
- b) The broad methodology to be followed for the evaluation,
- c) The professional team who will be conducting the evaluation,
- d) Total financial estimate for undertaking the evaluation; and
- e) Details of similar studies/evaluation performed earlier in respect of any Government Organizations/Schemes.
