Ministry of Labour & Employment

1. Important policy decisions taken and major achievements during the month of August, 2024.

A. Labour Reforms: As a part of the legislative reforms, existing 29 Acts in the central sphere have been subsumed in the four Codes. All Codes have been passed by the Parliament and notified, except date of implementation. The Code on Wages, 2019 was notified in the Gazette of India on 8th August, 2019, and the Industrial Relations Code, 2020, the Code on Social Security, 2020 and the Occupational Safety, Health and Working Conditions Code, 2020 were notified in the Gazette of India on the 29th September, 2020. Status of rules pre-published by the States/ UTs, under four Codes is in Annexure.

Broadly, seven States/ UTs, viz, Meghalaya, Nagaland, Tamil Nadu, West Bengal, Lakshadweep, Andaman & Nicobar Islands, and NCT of Delhi have not prepublished draft rules under Labour Codes.

During the month of August, 2024, regional level meeting with representatives of Karnataka, Kerala, Tamil Nadu, Telangana, Puducherry, A&N Islands was held on 30.08.2024 in Bengaluru to discuss various issues including "Labour Reforms", with participation of Hon'ble MoS for Labour and Employment, Secretary (Labour) and other senior officers of Govt. of India and States / UTs.

B. **Governance Reforms**: Shram Suvidha Portal: As on 31.08.2024, 45,50,247 Labour Identification Numbers (LIN) have been cumulatively generated (since October 2014) as opposed to 41,98,415 as on 31.08.2023. This shows a rise of 3,51,832 in LIN generation over the last one year.

C. e-Shram Portal:

- On 31.08.2024, e-Shram portal completed a total of 30 crore registrations of unorganised workers and were assigned Universal Account Numbers (UAN). e-Shram is presently integrated with NCS, Skill India, Digital, PMSYM, MyScheme, etc. and efforts are ongoing for integration across other relevant Ministries.
- ii. The Ministry of Labour & Employment is developing eShram portal as "One-Stop-Solution" with aims to facilitate access of unorganized sector labour to various social security schemes being implemented by various Ministries/ Departments through eShram portal. So far, data of 10 schemes such as PM-SVANidhi, MGNREGA, Pradhan Mantri Awas Yojana Gramin (PMAY-G), Ration Card etc. has been mapped with eShram database during the period.
- iii. e-Shram portal is registered on MY Bharat portal on 5th August 2024.

D. Launch of MIS Portal for Building & other Construction Workers and Inter-State Migrant Workers (ISMW) :

- With an objective to ensure saturation of welfare schemes in respect of Building and other Construction Workers (BoCWs) and Inter-State Migrant Workers (ISMWs) from the States/UTs, a MIS Portal has been launched on 21st August, 2024, and States/UTs have started entering data. More than 5.71 Crore BoCWs have been registered by States/UTs, and the importance of entering updated information on the portal is being emphasized in regional meetings as well.
- Once the data is entered by all States/UTs, it will be easier to track the Cess collection, its utilisation etc for BoCWs.
- It will also help the Ministry in getting the details related to migrant workers and ensuring the portability of various government schemes.
- The MIS will give various details in respect of Inter-State Migrant Workers thus helping in taking policy initiatives for their welfare and social security.

E. Employees Provident Fund Organization (EPFO):

- i. Deployment of Online System for Surrender of Exemption and Transfer of Past Accumulations: A new online system concerning the surrender of exemption and the transfer of members' previous accumulations has been launched on 13.08.2024. This system can be accessed through the Employer's Login of the Unified Portal. It is designed for employers from exempted establishments to file their applications and necessary documents online, which will then be processed by the Regional Offices.
- ii. The provisional payroll data of EPFO released on 20thAugust 2024 highlights that EPFO has added 19.29 lakh net subscribers during the month of June, 2024. The year over year analysis shows a growth of 19.62% in net member additions compared to June 2023.
- iii. Total 228.87 lakhs claim (Final PF Settlements, Death Claims, Insurance Claims and Partial withdrawals/advances including LIP) have been settled by EPFO offices from 01.04.2024 to 31.08.2024 disbursing an amount of ₹96,139.24 crores to PF members.
- iv. Since 01.04.2024, Aadhaar seeding for 57.56 lakh subscribers, taking the coverage to 99.24%; Bank account seeding for 29.09 lakh subscribers, with coverage reaching 66.61%; and mobile number seeding for 46.92 lakh subscribers taking the coverage to 85.87%, has been done.
- V. Monthly 'Nidhi Aapke Nikat' programme was conducted on 27.08.2024. Camps were held in 647 districts which was attended by 18,288 participants. A total of 7,518 grievances were received and 6,813 were resolved.

- Administrative Approval & Expenditure Sanction (AA&ES) has been issued for an amount of Rs. 52,43,58,906/- for the Up-gradtion of existing ESIC Hospital from 50 beds to 100 beds at Hubli, Karnataka.
