Ministry of Labour & Employment

- **1.** Important policy decisions taken and major achievements during the month of September, 2024.
- **A.** Labour Reforms: Broadly, seven States/ UTs, viz, Meghalaya, Nagaland, Tamil Nadu, West Bengal, Lakshadweep, Andaman & Nicobar Islands, and NCT of Delhi have not pre-published draft rules under Labour Codes¹. Status of rules pre-published by the States/ UTs, under four Codes is in **Annexure-1**. To facilitate these States/ UTs in drafting rules under Labour Codes, regional level meetings were held, delineated below, and extensive discussions held. Further, expert resource persons, are engaging with these States/ UTs to handhold them.

To bring harmony across rules of Central and States/ UTs under Labour Codes and evolve consensus, six regional meeting have been held to discuss the gaps/divergences between the Central draft Rules and draft rules pre-published by States/UTs under Labour Codes. Four regional level meetings were held during September 2024, viz on 06.09.2024, 15.09.2024, 20.09.2024 and 30.09.2024 in Chandigarh, Rajkot, Bhubaneswar and Lucknow respectively with the representatives of States/UTs. In the aforesaid meetings States/UTs agreed to rectify the gaps/divergences in their respective draft rules. States/UTs which have not prepublished their rules in respect of one or more Labour Codes, also agreed to frame their respective rules and pre-publish the same for general information. States/ UTs also agreed to consider to modify their rules in case of divergences so as to align them with Central Rules.

Reforms undertaken by States under existing Act were also discussed and showcased during the regional meetings, with objective of cross-learnings.

Further, Secretary (L&E) chaired interaction meeting with industry representatives, CII and employers on 05.09.2024 and 19.09.2024 at Chandigarh and Bhubaneswar respectively in which, inter-alia, the Employment Linked Incentive (ELI) scheme announced in Budget 2024-25 and Labour reforms were discussed, including ESIC & EPFO related reform agenda, with industry & employers, including some Labour Unions.

Besides above interactions, focused stakeholder consultations were held to draw guidelines of ELI Scheme at the level of Union Labour and Employment Minister with employers organisation on 03.09.2024, and at Secretary (L&E) level with employer organisations, inter-Ministerial consultations and Research and Academic Institutions on 13.09.2024, 17.09.2024 and 19.09.2024 respectively. These interactions gave valuable insights to make ELI scheme effective and robust.

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¹ As a part of the legislative reforms, existing 29 Acts in the central sphere have been subsumed in the four Codes. All Codes have been passed by the Parliament and notified, except date of implementation. The Code on Wages, 2019 was notified in the Gazette of India on 8th August, 2019, and the Industrial Relations Code, 2020, the Code on Social Security, 2020 and the Occupational Safety, Health and Working Conditions Code, 2020 were notified in the Gazette of India on the 29th September, 2020.

B. Governance Reforms: Shram Suvidha Portal: As on 30.09.2024, 45,68,890 Labour Identification Numbers (LIN) have been cumulatively generated (since October 2014) as opposed to 42,24,036 as on 30.09.2023. This shows a rise of 3,44,854 in LIN generation over the last one year.

C. e-Shram Portal:

- On 30.09.2024, e-Shram portal completed a total of 30.16 crore registrations of unorganised workers and were assigned Universal Account Numbers (UAN). e-Shram is presently integrated with NCS, Skill India, Digital, PMSYM, MyScheme, etc. and progress is seen in integration across other relevant Ministries.
- ii. The Ministry of Labour & Employment is developing eShram portal as "OneStop-Solution" with aims to facilitate access of unorganized sector labour to various social security schemes being implemented by various Ministries/ Departments through eShram portal.
- iii. In this regard, an interaction/ meeting under the chairmanship of Hon'ble Minister (Labour& Employment) was held with key stakeholders for extending social protection to Platform Workers and on boarding of Aggregators on eShram. For this purpose, an advisory was issued on 16.09.2024.

D. Employees Provident Fund Organization (EPFO):

- i. The provisional payroll data of EPFO released on 23rd September 2024 highlights that EPFO has added 19.94 lakh net subscribers during the month of July, 2024, marking the highest recorded increase since payroll data tracking began in April 2018. EPFO added 10.52 lakh new members in July 2024, representing a 2.66% increase over June 2024 and a 2.43% rise compared to July 2023.
- ii. Total 284.90 lakhs claim (Final PF Settlements, Death Claims, Insurance Claims and Partial withdrawals/advances including LIP) have been settled by EPFO offices from 01.04.2024 to 30.09.2024 disbursing an amount of ₹1,19,556.44 crores to PF members.
- iii. Since 01.04.2024, Aadhaar seeding for 69.54 lakh subscribers, taking the coverage to 99.24%; Bank account seeding for 35.41 lakh subscribers, with coverage reaching 66.55%; and mobile number seeding for 57.10 lakh subscribers taking the coverage to 85.95%, have been done.
- iv. Monthly 'Nidhi Aapke Nikat' programme was conducted on 27.09.2024. Camps were held in 686 districts which was attended by 22,540 participants. A total of 7,862 grievances were received and 7,084 were resolved.

E. Employees State Insurance Corporation (ESIC):

i. UAN Seeding of Insured Persons in Panchdeep Application:

2,08,70,200 UAN seeding of IPs has been completed till September, 2024. The percentage amounts to be 56% approximately.

F. V. V. Giri National Labour Institute (VVGNLI), Noida:

VV Giri National Labour Institute had organized 16 training programmes and 01 Workshops during the month of September, 2024, which were attended by 404 participants.

H. Labour Bureau:

The inflation rate based on Consumer Price Index Number for Industrial Workers (CPI-IW) base year 2016=100 moderated to 2.44 per cent for the month of August, 2024, as compared to 6.91 per cent during the corresponding month of the previous year.

I. International Meetings:

- i. Secretary, Ministry of Labour & Employment, Ms. Sumita Dawra, led the Indian delegation at the BRICS Labour and Employment Ministerial Meeting held under the Russian Presidency on 9-10 Sept, 2024 in the city of Sochi, Russia. The Ministers/ Heads of Delegation of the member countries viz. Brazil, Russia, India, China and South Africa participated in the meeting. Ministers/Heads of Delegation of the new members of BRICS Partnership: Egypt, Ethiopia, Iran, and the United Arab Emirates also attended the meeting.
- ii. Discussions were held on strategies for BRICS plus countries for lifelong professional education, vocational guidance, platform employment, ensuring safe and healthy working environment, and social support. Secretary (L&E) made interventions on all four priority areas and highlighted the progressive steps taken by Government of India.
- iii. One of the significant outcomes of the aforesaid meeting was the adoption of the BRICS Labour & Employment Ministers' Declaration. The Declaration recognized the need for developing: comprehensive strategies for life-long learning, vocational guidance, continuous professional education; modernization of employment services; ensuring safe working conditions; welfare of the platform workers and bolstering robust social support mechanisms.
