^{*}Target of 60% has been set as the wage ceiling is Rs. 15,000/- from 01.09.2014. Only EPF members having salary upto wage ceiling become entitled for EPS membership and 1.16% Government Contribution. Since most of the new members joining have wages more than Rs. 15,000/-, so they are not eligible for 1.16% Government Contribution. A target of 100% can be kept, however, it would be effective only when membership of EPS is made mandatory upto wage ceiling for all members.

^{**}It captures the number of beneficiaries whose pension as per formula is less than Rs. 1,000/- (due to low contribution or less pensionable service). The pension is brought to Rs. 1,000/- by Government Contribution. Hence, accurate target setting is difficult. Target of 25% has been set by taking numerator as 19,87,338 (achievement of FY 2023-24) and denominator as 78,66,628 (as per data on EPFO dashboard).

[^]The target can be kept as 100% subject to (i) only those pensioners be treated as beneficiaries who are receiving pension after submitting their DLCs i.e. as soon as the pension is stopped for want of DLC, that pensioner shall not be considered as a beneficiary; and (ii) the target of 100% may not be achieved as there would be certain cases of updation of Life Certificate by their submission in paper form like medical compulsions, etc.

The registered members of Family Pension-cum-Life Assurance Scheme, as on date, are the number of Family Pension Beneficiaries receiving monthly family pension from ATEPFO. A member being eligible for Family-Pension-cum Life Assurance Scheme shall be a registered member / beneficiary for receiving the monthly Family Pension benefit of the scheme and, hence, the target is 100% in FY 2025-26.

^{**}The total number of Tea Plantation Workers (eligible members) covered under Family Pension-cum-Life Assurance Scheme and Deposit Linked Insurance Scheme for FY 2025-26 has been estimated at 21,442 and 3,105, respectively, (i.e. total eligible members = 24,547]. The total number of Tea Plantation Workers is estimated at 13.50 Lakh for FY 2025-26. Therefore, the percentage of eligible members of Family Pension-cum-Life Assurance Scheme and Deposit Linked Insurance Scheme of the total members of Tea Plantation Workers is 1.81% (24,547/13,50,000*100). This is a low target as compared to the total number of tea plantation workers, reasons for which can be attributed to the criteria for eligibility under Family Pension-cum-Life Assurance Scheme and Deposit Linked Insurance Scheme, which being death while in service.
