- 98% Disposal of Grievance Appeals: Out of 38,283 appeals received, 37,558 grievance appeals have been successfully resolved, reaffirming the Ministry's commitment to responsive governance.
- 500+ Cleanliness Drives Conducted: Swachhata campaigns were carried out across more than 500 sites, demonstrating the Ministry's deep-rooted commitment to maintaining hygienic and organized workplaces.

Looking Ahead: Special Campaign 5.0 (2nd – 31st October 2025):

The Ministry is gearing up for *Special Campaign 5.0*, a focused month-long initiative aimed at further institutionalizing cleanliness practices and reducing backlogs across all levels of the organization.
